Thank you for your response to 'Operation Warm Embrace'



Since October 10th, Russian missiles have destroyed Ukraine's power grid. Most Ukrainians are now living without warmth, light, water or connectivity. Millions of people are suffering from hunger and cold and the more vulnerable are dying. The health system is unable to operate—without electricity there is no cold store for vaccinations or to preserve blood, no power for incubators, no mobile system to call for an ambulance. Our partners are trying every single day to respond to people's needs by giving out food packages, hygiene packages, medicines, power generators and heating stoves. Thanks to your generous response, we have sent out seven generators to our partners and a number of heating stoves.

There is much more to do and so our Winter Emergency Appeal continues (re-named by Joshua as Operation Warm Embrace) as our partners are giving warmth literally and metaphorically!
