### **Uzhhorod: Equilibrium Project**







Incredibly, 533 children had completed this project by the end of May 2025. This summer, a further 75 children will benefit from the 14-day programme of equine therapy, massage, therapeutic play, craft, movement, music therapy and more. Some of the children have disabilities and more complex needs. They include a special group of 20 orphans from Lviv who will be able to live on-site. There will also be a party of children from Poltava.

One mother wrote: I also wanted to express my immense gratitude for this project. For Bohdan, horseback riding and massage are the minimum of mandatory rehabilitation for his diagnosis. Participation in the project gave my son a lot. He became more resilient, began to walk more evenly. He has a desire to walk! Now he can walk in a walker without help. Undoubtedly, we still have a long way to go, but I am very grateful for the help and attention to my child. This project also gave me great psychological support. Communication with other parents, care from the project volunteers, organization of everything down to the smallest details - inspired me and gave me motivation to move forward. Special thanks to Margo, who spared neither energy nor time for my son. DHM and Equilibrium are hugely grateful to everyone who gave grants, donations and/or raised money over the past year which has enabled Equilibrium to build their own stables and move to a new site with residential accommodation.

DHM trustee Helen Evans and her daughter Hannah are returning to Equilibrium in July with special gifts for the orphaned children. (See poster right). All funds raised through our 'teddy bear appeal' will go to those most in need.

- Project leader Margarita (Margo) Equilibrium is expanding fast and there is a huge need as the situation continues to deteriorate in the East and newly displaced people arrive. She asks for wisdom as the project grows.

- There is a great need for a larger minibus. Meanwhile, the current minibus is going in for a service and needs repairs.
- Paulina who has been in hospital following a fall from a horse.
- Helen and Hannah would be grateful for prayers for wisdom, for safety and that they are able to make all their connections as they travel.



### **Our Summer camps have started!**

These photographs are from **Oleksandr** in **Tsarichanka** who ran a camp for 60-70 children aged 5-10 from June 9-15. There will be similar camps in July for 12-18 year olds and in August for 9-15 year olds. Funding for these camps has been provided by DHM and Oleksandr is 'over the moon' with the grant we were able to give him recently. Many families in Ukraine are struggling to put food on the table so all the camps include plenty of meals and snacks.







# **Finding faith in Dnipro**



Our partner **Mykhailo** also has good plans for the summer and has been training young people to work with children and adolescents in summer camps and holiday activities planned for June, July, and August. They include a talent show, a sports camp, day camps, camps in tents and cabins and a trip to the Carpathian mountains. Most of the children have been internally displaced and some are children of 'fallen heroes.'

Mykhailo told us that 14 people were baptised in the River Dnipro. They publicly confirmed their faith and joined the local church. 'Among them is my daughter, Sofiyka.' You can watch the video on our Facebook page Facebook (posted June 5th)

Many people in Ukraine are finding faith. They go to church because they are hungry and churches are distributing food packages and free meals. They stay after receiving a warm welcome. They begin to read the Bible, receive a message of hope, pray and spend time with those who serve them with love and kindness.

- All those who are hungry (more than half of the people in the Kherson region in the south face severe hunger, and, two out of every five individuals face hunger in Zaporizhzhia as well as the Donetsk region in the east).

### Our humanitarian relief programmes are non-stop

Every week, **Sasha (right)** delivers aid to two villages in the 'grey zone' (the area on the frontlines) At the beginning of June, he delivered water (and 75 water containers as the people there had no way to store it). It is very difficult to live there because of the frequent bombing, shelling and drone attacks and minefields. There are no basic services. All the residents are elderly. They have already been evacuated but many returned because they had no-where else to live. They live in fear – will they remain on the Ukrainian side, or will

they be occupied?

**Sergey and Valentina (left)** have been distributing food packages to internally displaced people in the city of **Samar.** They say: 'As long as there is a need, we will try to be there to support.'









Salvation Evangelical Church, Poltava are giving out food boxes (above and right). Olena's story is the experience of many older people who have lost everything. Olena is 70 years old and a widow from Pokrovsk, Donetsk region. She was forced to leave her home in September 2024 as the front line kept getting closer. "I worked at a factory that was hit eight times. Explosions, stress, sleepless nights... After my children and grandchildren were evacuated, I was left alone. It was very hard. Especially at night, when the darkness and shelling would bring the worst thoughts." But today, she shares with gratitude: "Now I feel at peace. Kind people in Poltava took me in, and I attend the 'Salvation' church, where I find comfort. I'm truly thankful for the humanitarian and hygiene aid — it's so valuable to me. Heartfelt thanks to the church and sponsors for their care and kindness!"

Our partner, **Oleksii**, an army chaplain, delivers regularly to the needy in **Zaporizhzhia and Kherson**. On the right, social services are delivering food kits and toys to the families in difficult life circumstances. Far right: Delivering a large batch of frozen pizza from Germany to the military, civilians, children and the elderly. He says: 'It's not just foodit's a sign of love and caring, a piece of normal life where it has been gone a long time.' # Partner updates: Vasily and Sergey

In 2024, **Vasily** and his family had to leave their home and church in **Pokrovsk** because of the Russian advances. However, his work continues and he makes the 14-hour trip back at least once each week, delivering food, clothing and hygiene supplies. In June, he wrote, 'Yesterday, we came back from Pokrovsk direction. Tomorrow we are going again, to a rehab centre for military personnel. We will be delivering some goods, including medical multi-functional beds. Six of them are already inside the lorry – we are still loading. We can do more .... God bless you.'. The vast mileage over rugged terrain in war-torn areas has taken its toll on Vasily's vehicle, and he is in urgent need of a new one. He has calculated that '...in 2.5 years we drove 480,000 km. That's 12 times around the Equator! This is the largest expense item of our mission, about 80,000€!!! This is just the fuel - we also paid for many repairs to our vehicles.'







Our partner, **Sergey** is the senior pastor of "Light of Life" church (affiliated with the Association of Mennonite Brethren

Churches of Ukraine) in **Samar** and is also an army chaplain. We have been supporting Sergey regularly since the full-scale war began. He oversees chaplaincy work in a large geographical area and is frequently on the road as he ministers to both soldiers and civilians. Functioning automobiles are an essential tool for an effective chaplaincy ministry. They are vital for delivering aid and evacuating wounded soldiers, but also have a short lifespan, as they are at constant risk of being hit by a missile or running over a mine. Sergey has written, '*The cars save soldiers' lives*.' We are looking for Sergey's ideal vehicle - a 4-wheel drive jeep or pickup with automatic transmission.





At least three of our partners (**Sasha**, **Sergey and Oleksii**) are army chaplains as is **Dennis**, a friend of DHM who recently came to the UK and was warmly welcomed by Guildford Baptist Church. Dennis and his family (his wife and children are refugees in the UK) are pictured with Anna, Inna and Melanie - all volunteers with DHM. It was very moving to meet Dennis who has experienced all the brutality of war and personal loss. **Please pray for:** 

- Dennis and all army chaplains as they are challenged to find meaning in the terrible suffering endured by those who are serving in the armed forces. He asks for prayer as special editions of the Gospel of Mark are distributed to the military, in hospitals and in the trenches, that it will be a comfort and strength to those who receive it.
- Please pray for all Ukraine's defenders and especially for women in the military.

# Please pray for all our partners and especially for:

- Serhii and his family are now refugees in Germany and have an apartment for a few more months. Now they are looking for more permanent housing and processing documents. Please pray that they can get the documents completed quickly so that their son Alexander can be treated for his serious heart condition.
- For our partner, **Pastor Alexander D** who fled to Sweden for medical treatment at the beginning of the war (he almost died) but is now struggling with documentation and other issues.
- ♦ Sasha who needs, 'prayer support for recovery without surgery! God's will for everything'. (His own words)

### Support and friendship in difficult times

Many of our partners are now offering safe and supportive environments to support those who are vulnerable and hurting and affected by war-trauma. Our partner Sasha has been running art classes for those who remain in his community. The war has changed the lives of these women — their daughters and grandchildren have been evacuated; their husbands and sons have gone to war; they have lost relatives and friends and have no idea what tomorrow will bring.
